Plaid Cymru is led by Rhun ap Iorweth.




The Reform Party is led by Nigel Farage.

Plaid Cymru wants Wales to fully control its justice system.



The Reform Party want more police officers and support Stop and Search.

Devolution



The Conservatives want to overturn some laws from devolved governments.



Labour wants to uphold devolution and expand it for Wales.



The Liberal Democrats want to expand devolution for Wales.



The Green Party wants to give more powers to devolved governments.



Plaid Cymru wants Wales to become an independent nation.



The Reform Party may oppose devolution.

Healthcare



The Conservatives want to create an NHS app.



Labour want to use artificial intelligence make NHS services faster.



The Liberal Democrats want free personal care.



The Greens want more money for the NHS and more pay for NHS staff.



Plaid Cymru want more money from NHS Westminster to invest in the Welsh NHS.



The Reform Party want to turn the NHS into a private service.

Education



The Conservatives want to ban mobile phones in schools.



Labour want more teachers, nurseries, and breakfast clubs.



The Liberal Democrats want more money for schools and free school meals.



The Greens want more money for schools, special education, and free school meals.



Plaid Cymru want money for schools, lifelong learning, and free school meals.



The Reform Party want "patriotic education" and oppose LGBTQ+ education.

Immigration

Migration.
